



ASSEMBLY BILL 705 (AB705)

AB705 changes the assessment process and requires that we use high school information as well as the major to place students into transfer level classes

- Depending on previous work and GPA, it may be recommended, or required for students to enroll
 in a corequisite support class.
- Research has shown that students disappear between every step in the developmental sequence for math and English and are less likely to complete their goals.
- Students who have indicated that their goal is to transfer or earn an associates degree must complete a transfer level English and math course within one year.



ENGLISH

Transfer Level

- English 122 has not changed. It is still transfer level.
- English 122L will be a 5-unit version of English 122 that includes additional support and scaffolding.
 - It will provide extra support for students (e.g., refreshers on essay fundamentals, reading and study skills, integration with student services, more in-class work, etc.). This 5-unit course is transfer level.
- English 122AL will be a 5-unit version of English 122A (for English language learners) that includes additional support and scaffolding.
 - It will provide extra support for students (e.g., refreshers on essay fundamentals, reading and study skills, integration with student services, more in-class work, more focus on sentence-level issues common to English language learners, etc.). This 5-unit course is transfer level.



Developmental Level

- English 116 (Developmental Reading) and English 118 (Developmental Writing) no longer exist.
 - One section of English 117 exists, for students who would rather start at this level instead of with transfer-level English. It is integrated reading and writing at the development level (similar to what was previously 116 + 118).
- Five sections of ESL 117A also exist, for English-learners who would rather start at this level instead of with transfer-level English or transfer-level ESL. It is integrated reading and writing for the advanced ESL student.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

- ESL will be going through some changes to the curriculum in fall.
 - All students will complete the online placement process
 - ESL students will still have Accuplacer available to them through Fall of 2020 if they wish to use the standardized test.



ASSESSMENT DAY INFORMATION

- This process will take approximately 1 hour including:
 - a tour of the campus by student ambassadors
 - a presentation regarding financial aid with a question and answer period
- Students will need:
 - Their DVC Insite Portal login and password
 - A physical photo ID (not a picture on their phone)
 - To have completed the online orientation
 - To bring Special Admit Form
 - Staff will be on hand to sign students up for Counseling 095





If you'd like additional support, you may consider enrolling in the support course, ENGL 120, at the same time. If you're not sure, speak to a counselor to discuss your options.

English 122: First-Year College Composition and Reading

This option is for students who are ready to begin work at the college level and have the time to do a substantial amount of work outside class.

English 122 (3 units) engages students regularly in the writing and reading process with a substantial amount of college-level reading. You will read and analyze college-level texts and compose college-level essays that are coherent, detailed, and free of serious error. You will learn to use a variety of types of support in your essays, including primary and secondary research, and you'll also write at least one timed essay. Your instructor will help you develop the skills you need to complete all these reading and writing tasks, but with only three hours of class time a week, you will need to complete much of this work on your own.

English 122, First-Year College Composition and Reading, with the support course, English 120: First-Year College Composition and Reading Support

This option is for students who feel they need extra time and guidance to successfully complete college-level work.

These two courses (5 units total) combine the instruction in First-Year College Composition and Reading (ENGL-122) with additional support to help you be successful as you complete college-level work. English 122 engages students regularly in the writing and reading process with a substantial amount of college-level reading. In English 122, you will read and analyze college-level texts and compose essays that are well supported (using both primary and secondary research) and free of serious error. You will also write at least one timed essay. The support course (ENGL-120) offers you the opportunity to practice the college-level reading, writing, research, and critical-thinking skills you need to complete English 122 successfully, and it will give you more time with the instructor. Additionally, the course emphasizes study skills, reflection, and other practices that promote success in both English 122 and other college classes.
